#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Teaching methods adopted are learner Centric Programmes, introduced depending upon the abilities of the students & requirement of content. Since majority of the students are from minority Muslim community, with very poor socio-economic conditions, traditional method of chalk & talk is followed. Various other teaching learning methods are also adopted by teachers such as Group discussions, Peer teaching assignment, public speaking, internet browsing, Class room seminars, skill development exercise project based learning & computer assisted learning. Projects are also prepared by BBA students on specific topics & report are presented on Industrial Visits. OHP, LCD presentation & aids like charts, newspaper cuttings, clips from magazines, Video screening of films are in use. Introduction of compute fundamentals, a compulsory paper, enable the students to gain practical knowledge in using M.S Word, PPT, Internet, Email etc., The language skills are imparted through activities and experimental learning. Language lab is used by the students for improving their Spoken English "Add-on course on communicative English is also conducted every year. Access to Inflibnet and E-resources in the Library enhances the teaching learning process.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Chapter wise tests and preparatory examinations are conducted every semester. The performance of the students is discussed with them, revision of the syllabus is done keeping the slow learners in mind. Remedial classes are taken for the slow learners. Evaluation marks are also sent to the parents. As per the CBCS scheme 30 marks of Internal assessment is awarded based on the tests, assignments and attendance.

# Report on Analysis of feedback regarding curriculum recruit from various stakeholders.

#### 1. STUDENTS FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM

- \* Teachers are focussed on overall development of students hence importance is given to extra-curricular activities.
- Overall students are happy with the curriculum.

#### **Action Taken:**

- \* As majority of students expressed syllabus is challenging, Aids to teaching were adopted @AKCW such as ICT, Bridge Coarse & Mentor-Mentee programme.
- \* Some difficult subjects were not completed on time hence the teachers were instructed to complete & do the revision also.

#### 2. TEACHERS FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM

- \* Office representatives were send to get clarity on CBCS scheme.

#### 3. PARENTS' FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM

- \* Parents are happy about the course in which their ward is studying & may be their rating is based on the results.
- \* It is analysed that majority of the parents feel the course of their ward is very good. It is inferred that majority of the parents are happy & satisfied about the course of their ward. Irrespective of caste, creed, language, religion etc., the institution works on the foundation of secularism.

#### 3. The Context

The Institution was established with a vision of empowering the downtrodden girls' community. It faces few challenges while implementing the best practice as most of the parents are uneducated and they force their ward to discontinue education. In these cases the determined institution convinces the parents to send their daughters to continue studies.

#### 4. The Practice

The committed management and the institution start creating awareness about the importance of higher education to the parents at the time of admission. Even the students with low percentage are given admission as our aim is to give education to everyone. Admission is given to the course, sought by students/parents.
